I currently represent clients in both the Northern and Middle Districts of Georgia.

I am a member of the State Bar of Georgia and a member of the United States District Court for the Northern and Middle Districts of Georgia as well as the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit. I am currently a member of the Bankruptcy Section of the State Bar. I have been a member of the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the Northern District of Georgia since 1983. I have participated as a speaker with both the Institute of Continuing Legal Education in Georgia and Georgia State University Law School. I was also a member of a Bankruptcy Local Rules Committee in 1985. I currently do volunteer work as Counsel for the Truancy Intervention Program for the Juvenile Court of Gwinnett County.
